

## Scope of Services

PPOH will lead an eight (8) week paid summer fellowship program designed with the goal of learning life & work skills alongside professionals in the health care field and becoming positive sexual health messengers within their community. The YES! Program will provide empowerment skills development in two general and crucial content areas:

1. Comprehensive Sexuality Education: to provide medically accurate, inclusive, affirming sexuality health education in order to empower participants to take agency over the best choices for their own lives, health, relationships, and futures. This objective is foundational to the long term and ultimate goal of decreasing health disparities and increasing infant vitality in the community.
2. Career Development: to provide thoughtful, encouraging education to enable youth to build the skills to feel confident entering into professional and employment spaces.

PPOH will implement the Program in the following way:

1. Three (3) cohorts of youth ages 14-19 for a total of 50 youth in the full fellowship program.
2. The fellowship will require program participants to commit to three days per week and for an average of two hours a day during those 8 weeks.
3. The program will facilitate virtually and tech access needs for participants will be supported on a case-by-case basis.
4. One in-person cohort will be offered to participants if at least 10 potential participants select that option during their orientation. Considerations of location, transportation access, lunch incentives for attendance, and a different configuration for the trainings will be considered
5. Recruitment encompasses Franklin County. A goal of 50% of participants will reside in C1 priority zip codes.
6. Fellowship hours include attendance to sessions in a blend of OCSE/NCH facilitated content and training with guest topic experts. Recruitment and compensation of expert speakers as a core component.
7. Fellowship program completion is incentivized financially (e.g., cash, interview clothes) and with the opportunity to receive a professional reference from program staff.
8. If, CelebrateOne administration secures the commitment of other agencies to open their program participants to this summer program, each YES! Participant will be required to co-present (in a group of 4-5) a sexuality health education session to their peers in those agencies. Fifty participants = 10 - 12 presentation opportunities provided by C1 partners. The format of these presentations will be agreed upon in writing with CelebrateOne. Contractor will schedule organizations once contact and information for locations for presentations are given by CelebrateOne.
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10. Acquiring permission from the adults of the recipients is the responsibility of the hosting agency
11. A Special Event Day for all participants will be conducted. An opportunity for participants to gather in person with program staff for a day of guest speakers, activities, networking practice, lunch, and the chance to have a professional headshot taken.
12. An Evaluation is provided by The Ohio State University Department of Educational Psychology and Quantitative Research, Evaluation, and Measurement. Assessments are designed and administered under the direction of Dr. Eric Anderman and will provide data related to knowledge gain as well as attitude and intention changes.
13. A final report will be delivered on the program no later than 60 days post program.

Further the agreed upon programmatic timeline and training Commitment of this contract is a follow:

1. Fellowship includes 44 hours of sexual health education and work skills education (see draft syllabi below with an average of 6 hours per week schedule).
2. Fellowship program orientation sessions: 6/6/2022 - 6/17/2022
3. Fellowship program begins: 6/21/2022
4. Fellowship program ends: 8/12/2022
