Sir,

The following investigation was conducted concerning the City of Columbus' 2022 annual objection to the renewal of liquor permit 1173846 issued to CSC 5512 LLC, which was doing business as Queen of Hearts and Pelican Club (also doing business as "Lounge" per the records of the Division of Liquor Control), located at 5512 East Livingston Avenue, Columbus, Ohio 43232. The record owners of said permit are Chadwick Sherfey, Casey M. Duffey, and Shawn D. Wheeler.

After reviewing the State of Ohio, Franklin County, and City of Columbus records regarding the above liquor permit establishment, the following information has been compiled to support the objection to the renewal of the aforementioned permit issued by the State of Ohio.

The above listed liquor establishment has been issued a **D5** permit by the Division of Liquor. This permit grants the permit holder the privilege to sell alcoholic beverages at the above listed address.

A review of the Columbus Division of Police records revealed the Division of Police has created **thirteen** (13) official police reports concerning incidents at the listed liquor establishment between **January 2021** and **November 2022**. These reports referenced homicide, menacing, assault, noise, and patrons drinking outside the establishment, including:

May 20, 2021

In addition, the Columbus Division of Police and Division of Fire have been dispatched to **5512 East Livingston Avenue, Columbus, Ohio 43232** on **forty-eight (48)** calls for service, **twenty-six (26)** in 2021, and **twenty-two (22)** in 2022 at **Queen of Hearts / Pelican Club**. These calls for service include responses to a shooting, robbery, shots fired, persons with guns, prostitution, fights, intoxicated persons needing assistance, disturbances, and motor vehicle theft.
