BACKGROUND: The City's Department of Public Utilities ("DPU") is performing the Livingston-Noe Bixby Culvert Removal Project (project number 611724-100000) ("Public Project"). The City must acquire certain fee simple title and lesser real estate located in the vicinity of East Livingston Avenue from Noe Bixby Road to Culvert Road (collectively, "Real Estate") in order for DPU to timely complete the Public Project. The City passed Ordinance Number 2859-2021 authorizing the City Attorney to acquire the Real Estate. Accordingly, the City intends to appropriate and accept the Real Estate in the event the City Attorney is unable to (i) locate the owners of the Real Estate, or (ii) agree with the owners of the Real Estate in good faith regarding the amount of just compensation.

WHEREAS, the City intends to improve certain public (sewer or water) infrastructure by allowing the Department of Public Utilities ("DPU") to engage in the Livingston-Noe Bixby Culvert Removal Project (project number 611724-100000) ("Public Project"); and

WHEREAS, the City intends for the City Attorney to acquire the necessary fee simple title and lesser real estate located in the vicinity of East Livingston Avenue from Noe Bixby Road to Culvert Road ("Real Estate") in order to complete the

Public Project; and

WHEREAS, the City intends for the Real Estate's acquisition to help make, improve, or repair certain portions of public sewer infrastructure and associated appurtenances; and

WHEREAS, the City intends to appropriate and accept the Real Estate in the event the City Attorney is unable to (i) locate the owners of the Real Estate, or (ii) agree with the owners of the Real Estate in good faith regarding the amount of just compensation; **NOW, THEREFORE**,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

SECTION 1. That the City, pursuant to the City's Charter, Columbus City Code, Chapter 909 (1959), Constitution of the state of Ohio, and the Ohio Revised Code, Chapter 719, declares the necessity and intent to appropriate and accept the fee simple title and lesser real estate to the following listed parcels ("Real Estate"), which are fully described in their associated exhibits and incorporated into this resolution for reference, in order for the Department of Public Utilities ("DPU") to complete the Livingston-Noe Bixby Culvert Removal Project (project number 611724-100000) ("Public Project").
