Projects and Renovations

**First Avenue School, Columbus, Ohio, Wood Companies:** Project Architect for renovation of Existing School Building. The renovation of the building into office space maintained existing interior features such as the transoms, wood wainscot, chalkboards, etc. Careful consideration was given to maintain the historic fabric of the exterior.

**680- 698 N. High St, Carriage Place, Columbus, Ohio, Wood Companies:** Project Architect for renovation of existing rooming house and retail space. Renovation included the addition of an elevator and exit tower to the rear of building.

The renovation included development of new storefronts facing Warren and the maintaining of storefronts on High St. The project also maintained the interior auto ramp to the second floor as a design feature.
