

ROBERT D. LOVERSIDGE, JR., FAIA

Bob Loversidge is an architect and president & CEO of Schooley Caldwell Associates, a 63-year old architecture, landscape architecture, engineering, planning and interior design firm in Columbus, Ohio. In 1998, AIA Ohio awarded Schooley Caldwell Associates its prestigious firm Gold Medal. Bob is a past chair of The American Institute of Architects' national Historic Resources Committee, and the AIA has elevated him to its prestigious College of Fellows in recognition of his national contributions to historic preservation architectural design. In September 2006, Bob was awarded the AIA Ohio Gold Medal, the highest honor bestowed on an individual for exemplary architectural accomplishments.

Active in historic preservation for over 30 years, Bob was involved in saving Daniel Burnham's Union Station Arch, is a founding member, past president and honorary trustee of the Columbus Landmarks Foundation, and is a past president of the Ohio Preservation Alliance. Mr. Loversidge has served on the Board of Advisors for the Building Preservation Technology Program at Belmont Technical College in St. Clairsville, Ohio, and is a member of the Downtown Commission in Columbus and the Council of Advisors of the Institute for Preservation and Contemporary Design. In 1999, he was awarded the *Outstanding Person* award by the Columbus Landmarks Foundation for lifetime service to preservation in Ohio; in 2002, he received the AIA Ohio *Public Service Award* for significant service to the community. He lives in a National Register historic district, and has worked on historic buildings throughout Ohio and as far away as India, Pakistan and Yugoslavia.

Since 1988, Bob has served as principal-in-charge of the \$100 million renovation, restoration and addition project at Ohio's National Historic Landmark Statehouse, a project which has received over a dozen major awards for design excellence. Recently completed is the Ohio Judicial Center, an \$85 million adaptive use of the 1933 "Moderne" style Ohio Departments Building into a fitting "new" home for the Supreme Court of Ohio. Other current preservation projects include Frank Lloyd Wright's Westcott House in Springfield, Ohio; the Old Montgomery County Courthouse in Dayton; the Kansas Statehouse in Topeka; the Utah Capitol in Salt Lake City; and the Minnesota State Capitol in Saint Paul. Today, Schooley Caldwell is serving as Architect of Record for redevelopment of the historic Lazarus department store in Columbus – which will be the largest LEED certified project in the Midwest.
