The following investigation was conducted concerning the City of Columbus' 2019 annual objection to the renewal of liquor permit **4949437** issued to **LCZJ INC**, which is doing business as **Sunoco** located at **1690 S. High St., Columbus, Ohio 43207**. The recorded owner of said permit is **Laura Ansar**.

After reviewing the State of Ohio, Franklin County, and City of Columbus records regarding the above liquor permit establishment, the following information has been compiled to support the objection to the renewal of the aforementioned permit issued by the State of Ohio.

The above listed liquor establishment has been issued a **C1** and **C2** permits by the Division of Liquor. This permit grants the permit holder the privilege to sell alcoholic beverages at the above listed address.

An inquiry of liquor violations revealed that the permit holder has received the following violations in **2019**:

A review of the Columbus Division of Police records revealed the Division of Police has created **(22) twenty-two** official police reports concerning incidents at the listed liquor establishment between **January 2018** and **November 2019**. These reports referenced robbery, felony theft, possession and sale of illegal narcotics,

domestic violence to a victim under 17, liquor law offenses, simple theft, menacing, simple assaults, criminal damaging, and drug overdoses.

In addition, the Columbus Division of Police have been dispatched to **1690 S. High St., Columbus, Ohio 43207** on **(63) sixty-three** calls for service, **(32) thirty-two** in 2018, and **(31) thirty-one** in 2019 at **Sunoco**.

A review of the Columbus Division of Fire records revealed that there have been **(17) seventeen** overdoses in **2019** at **Sunoco**.
