1. Reasons for waiving City Code bid procedure:

Salesforce has already been implemented in the Department of Development and at the State and Regional levels including JobsOhio and Columbus 2020. Purchasing this software will allow the City to share data related to projects with our partners along with tracking, reporting, creating workflows, and logging events and activities that will help us to better manage our economic development projects. The Department of Development has been utilizing Carahsoft services since 2013 and we are continuing to use them for on-going project work and license renewal.

 - written quotations
 - negotiations
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4. Informal bids received and prices for each:

Only one bid was received due to the fact that the Ohio Development Services Agency, JobsOhio, and the Regional Partners, including Columbus 2020 are already using this software. Moving forward with the purchase of Salesforce instead of looking at alternate options will save the City additional expenses for the creation, customization, and compatibility software to share data with the State, JobsOhio, and regional partners.

5. If lowest bid was not accepted, explain criteria for award:

As Salesforce has already been implemented in the Department of Development and at partnering entities, the software only needs to be modified to meet the needs of the City instead of completely designing a new system which will save the City a significant amount of funding.
