WHEREAS, the 2015 National Hockey League All-Star Celebration brought 40,000 visitors and 10,000 skaters to Winter Park festivities at McFerson Commons Park over a 10 day period, and the Columbus Blue Jackets Foundation seeks to extend the experience in 2016 to 30 days making it necessary to close McConnell Blvd. from Spring Street to New Public Way from January 3 through March 4, to accommodate the placement of ice support equipment on a downtown street, and

WHEREAS, the Columbus Blue Jackets Foundation plans to file an application with the Columbus Recreation and Parks Department for a Block Party Permit to close a public street necessary to conduct the 2016 Winter Park festivities, and

WHEREAS, the duration of the street closure for the 2016 Winter Park festivities will exceed the maximum allowable closure period of five (5) consecutive days, as contained in Section 923.03 (c) of the Columbus City Codes, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to waive Section 923.03 (c) of the Columbus City Codes to authorize the Director of Recreation and Parks to issue a Block Party Permit for the 2016 Winter Park for the closure of a public street for more than five (5) consecutive days once their street closure application has been approved; now, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

Section 1. That Section 923.03 (c) of the Columbus City Codes be and is hereby waived as pertaining to the 2016 Columbus Blue Jackets Foundation Winter Park for a limited purpose of closing a public street for more than five (5) consecutive days.

Section 2. That the Director of Recreation and Parks be and is hereby authorized and directed to issue a Block Party Permit for the 2016 Columbus Blue Jackets Winter Park for more than five (5) consecutive days, upon receipt of a completed Block Party Permit meeting all existing requirements for issuance of said permit.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
