Location: 700 CHILDRENS DRIVE (43205), being 52.7± acres

generally located from the southeast corner of Parsons Avenue and Mooberry Street, east to the southwest corner of Mooberry Street and the first alley east of and parallel with Eighteenth Street, south to the northwest

corner of the first alley east of and parallel with

Eighteenth Street and Livingston Avenue, south to the southeast corner of Livingston Avenue and Heyl Avenue, west to the southeast corner of Jackson Street and Putnam Street, west to the southwest corner of Jackson Street and Parsons Avenue, and north to the northwest corner of Parsons Avenue and Denton Alley, north and west to the southwest corner of Livingston and Parsons

Avenues, west 732 feet along the north side of

BACKGROUND:

The 52.7± acre site is developed with the Children's Hospital and related medical research, office, heliport, and parking facilities. The main purpose of the application is to add the former grocery store at the northwest corner of Livingston and Parsons Avenue into Subarea B. Subarea A is reconfigured by removal of former right-of-way which now needs rezoned. Less than half an acre is added to Subarea C. Subarea B would allow uses in the C-4 and I Districts in addition to hospital related uses.

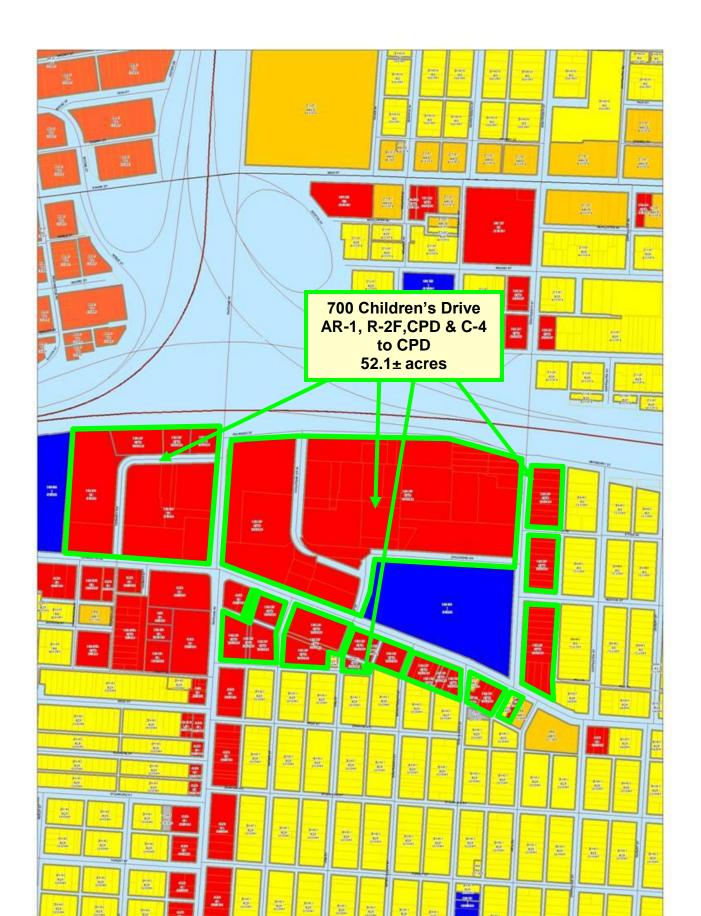
To the north across Mooberry Street is Interstate 70 and the ramp to Interstate

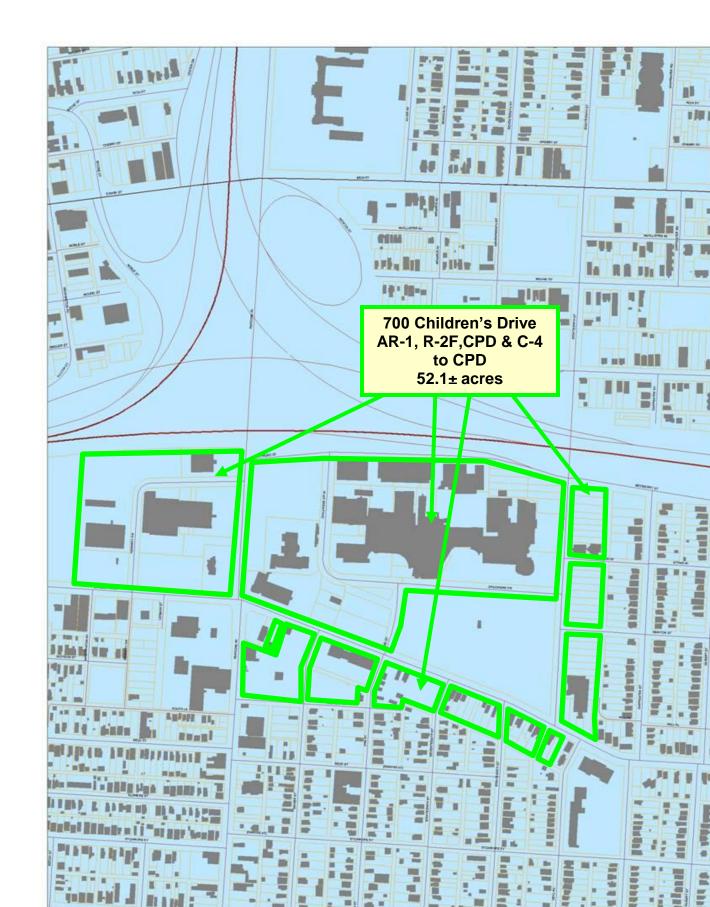
71. To the east are single-family dwellings zoned in the R-3, Residential District. To the south is Livingston Park zoned in the I, Institutional District. Also to the south, across Livingston Avenue are single-family and multi-family residential dwellings zoned in the R-4, Residential District and businesses zoned in the C-4 Commercial and L-C-4, Limited Commercial Districts. To the west across Parsons Avenue is a commercial shopping center and automobile dealer zoned in the C-4, Commercial District. To the west of subarea B is a school zoned in the I, Institutional District.

- In addition to the changes mentioned above, the proposed CPD text increases many setbacks that were agreed to in the existing CPD text. A provision was added that allows parking in excess of code on the main campus to be used to satisfy the code required parking on Children's Hospital's property on Fulton Street north of I-70.and vice-versa. The total code requirement for both must be determined and be satisfied between the two properties. The applicants have also reduced the allowable height from 200 feet to 150 feet in subarea B. It also clarifies that loading spaces need not be screened along alleys.
- The Columbus Thoroughfare Plan identifies East Livingston and Parsons Avenues as 4-2D and 4-2 arterials requiring a minimum of 60 and 50 feet of right-of-way from centerline respectively.

<u>CITY DEPARTMENTS' RECOMMENDATION</u>: Approval.

The proposed modification to the CPD Plan and Text would allow for orderly expansion of the hospital and associated facilities. The allowance of retail, office institutional uses in the expanded subarea B is consistent with the development and zoning patterns of the area. The remainder of the changes increase standards over the existing CPD.
