BACKGROUND:

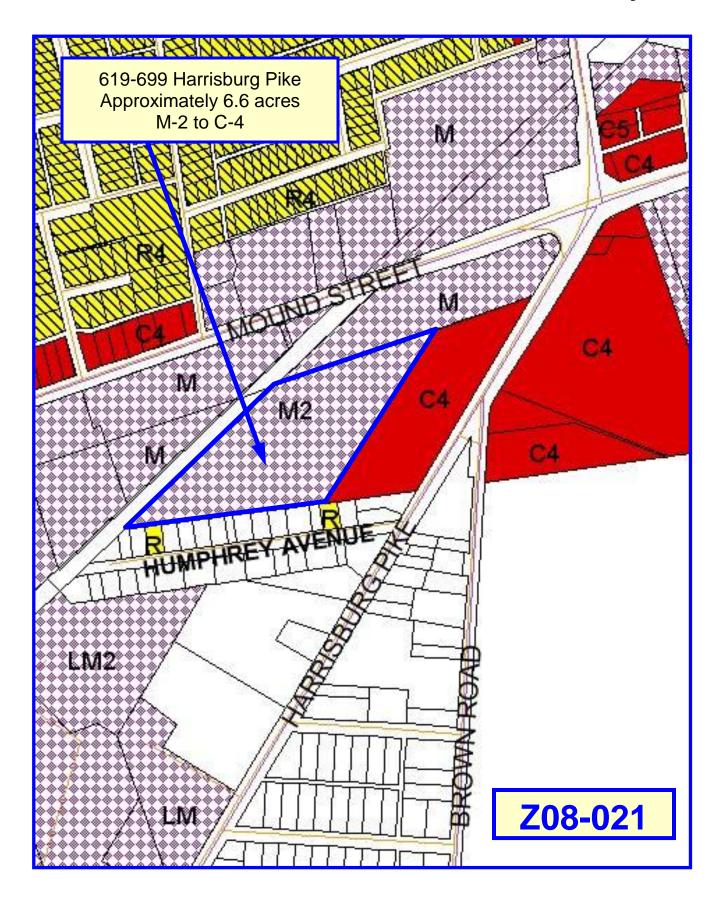
- This application was tabled at the July 10, 2008 Development Commission meeting. There is ongoing discussion between staff and the applicant regarding right-of-way dedication, but no resolution at this time.
- The 10.13± acre site is developed with an existing shopping center and zoned in the M, Manufacturing and M-2, Manufacturing Districts. The applicant is requesting the C-4, Commercial District to conform the shopping center on the entire site. Retail uses are not permitted in the M-2 district.
- To the north of the site is a shopping center zoned in the M, Manufacturing District. To the east is a shopping center in the C-4, Commercial District. To the south is a single-family residential development located in Franklin Township. To the west, across the railroad tracks are warehouses and a retail establishment in the M, Manufacturing District.
- The Southwest Area Commission recommended approval of this request.
- The Columbus Thoroughfare Plan identifies Harrisburg Pike as a 4-2d arterial requiring a minimum of 60 feet of right-of-way from the centerline and Mound Street as a 4-2 arterial requiring a minimum of 50 feet of right-of-way from centerline.

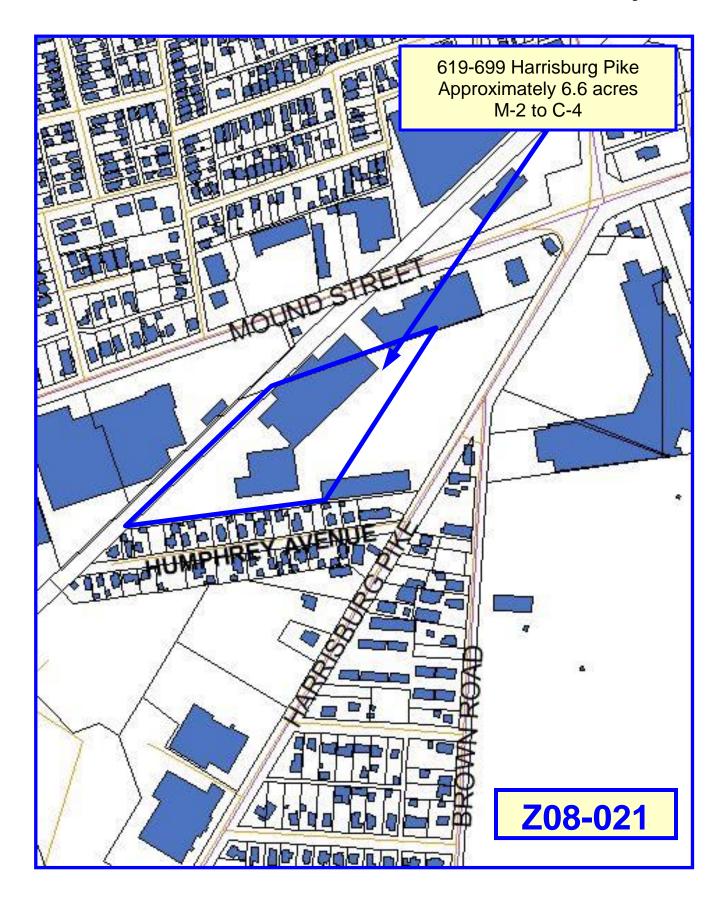
CITY DEPARTMENTS RECOMMENDATION: Approval.*

Staff supports the use, however, the right-of-way issue has not been resolved, therefore staff recommends disapproval. Staff's recommendation will be revised to approval with the resolution of this issue.

The proposed C-4, Commercial District, will conform an existing shopping center. The rezoning will remove the M-2, Manufacturing District which is currently adjacent to the single-family residential uses to the south. The request will not introduce a new use and is compatible with development in the area.

*The staff recommendation was for disappoval due to a right-of-way issue that had not been resolved. The site included areas zoned in the M, Manufacturing and M-2, Manufacturing Districts. The applicant reduced the site to 6.6 acres, as shown on the following maps, including only the area zoned M-2, which does not permit commercial uses. The M-2 portion of the site was not adjacent to any roads, so the right-of-way issue was no longer pertinent. Staff is now in approval of the request.
