This project consists of the inspection, maintenance and necessary repair of various multiple hearth incinerators and associated equipment located at various City of Columbus, Ohio, Division of Sewerage and Drainage Facilities. These facilities consist of the Southerly Wastewater Treatment Plant (SWWTP) and the Jackson Pike Wastewater Treatment Plant (JPWWTP). A comprehensive inspection report will be completed by the Contractor and delivered to the Project Manager annually.

6. <u>A narrative timeline for the contract including a beginning date, beginning and ending dates for known phases of the contract and a projected ending date.</u>

This contract is expected to go into effect November, 2011. This is bid as a one (1) year contract. No community outreach or environmental factors are considered for this project.
