Danielle P. Tong serves as executive director of CelebrateOne in Columbus Ohio, the city's initiative to reduce infant mortality, improve maternal and child health outcomes and reduce health disparities.

She was appointed to the position in July 2023 by Mayor Andrew J. Ginther. As executive director of the public-private entity, Danielle stewards the organization's five-year strategic plan with the goal to reduce the infant mortality rate by 2030 by elevating evidence-base practices and data-supported promising practices, advocating for policies and practices that center families, addressing racism and biases that fuel disparities in birth outcomes for Black babies and birthing parents, and building an empowered and active coalition of community members and stakeholders to champion the work.
