1. Reasons for waiving City Code bid procedure:

- emergency breakdown causing unplanned need

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2. Detailed explanation of reason (must be completed by division):

A professional services contract in the amount of \$38,398.50 was awarded to Resource International, Inc. in 2001 for the study of the City's residential pavement design procedures. This firm established a design methodology, which was adopted by the City of Columbus in 2002 when the new residential pavement standards were issued. The City is now intending to extend the previous effort to now study its pavement design policy for major arterial roadways, which are typically built under capital improvement projects. It is more expedient and less costly for the City to award a new contract to Resource International, Inc. as the methodology and know-how previously developed are provided through those professionals who worked on the residential pavement standards. The experience, information and insight in possession of these individuals will save time and money for the City. Another firm would have to start from a point of no knowledge of the previous effort, its findings, and the decisions made during analysis. The required staff at Resource International, Inc. are available and necessary to complete the review and changes to the City's non-residential pavement design policy.
