Northwest Corridor Transit Implementation, Columbus, OH

Principal/Project Manager; The Northwest Corridor is at the forefront of new high-capacity transit network development in the Central Ohio region. Identified as a LinkUs corridor following the insight 2050 Corridor Concepts Study, this preferred transit alignment will be closely paired with the larger regional growth initiative. Jason is leading the OHM team, working with TransSystems on this complex project that includes dedicated guideway BRT design, land use, sewer capacity analysis, highway corridor realignment, streetscape design and mobility planning. This multi-year effort is currently taking the design to 30% with the intent to pursue funding for construction of this vital regional transportation link.

Northwest Corridor Equitable Transit Oriented Development (ETOD) Analysis, Columbus, OH

Principal/Project Manager; The Northwest Corridor ETOD Analysis included the identification of redevelopment sites along the planned bus rapid transit corridor that includes Columbus' Arena District, The Ohio State University, and several medical campuses. OHM led this planning effort to steer equitable development including affordable housing, fresh food, childcare, education, and medical care.

Public Square Connectivity & Public Realm Plan, Cleveland, OH

Lead Planner; Public Square is the central core and hub both for the city and the downtown neighborhood, connecting residents of Cleveland to those of Cuyahoga County and Northeast Ohio. The design of these spaces and the interaction between daily users and downtown visitors is critical to the vitality of the urban core. OHM is currently leading a connectivity and public realm plan that positions this area for future development while prioritizing the safety and efficiency of multimodal transportation.
