

Nannette V. Maciejunes was named Executive Director of the Columbus Museum of Art in November 2003 after serving as the acting director for one year and as Chief Curator with administrative responsibility for the curatorial and registrars departments for ten years. She received the 2006 Governor's Award for the Arts in Ohio in the category of Arts Administration.

Ms. Maciejunes attended Stanford's Executive Program for Nonprofit Leaders –Arts in 2006 and the Getty's Leadership Institute for Museum Management (MMI) in 1999. She graduated *summa cum laude* from Denison University with a B.A. in Art History and an M.A. and further graduate studies toward a Ph.D. from the Ohio State University. She has been at the Columbus Museum of Art since she began as a curatorial research assistant in 1984, with a brief absence when she served as Curator of Collections and Exhibitions (1989-1990) at The Dixon Gallery and Gardens in Memphis. Her area of scholarly expertise is early twentieth-century American art and European Modernism.

Under her leadership, the Museum has adopted and implemented a new mission: to offer great experiences with great art to everyone. She was instrumental in the acquisition of the Photo League Collection and the Schiller Collection of Art of Social Conscience.
