University Community Business Association (UCBA) 1993-present: Serve as Executive Director of the Association. Efforts focus on economic development related issues; business recruitment, retention and expansion; enhancing the delivery of a wide array of public services; code enforcement; assisting in the implementation of the Campus Partners 1996 University Neighborhoods Revitalization Plan. Responsibilities include: administration, board interface, committee coordination, annual budget, cash flow projections, staffing, grant writing, contract administration, membership, fund raising, reimbursement accounts, and representation of the Association on various task forces, committees, and boards of the community, city, state. The Ohio State University, and Campus Partners. Directed a complete reevaluation and revision of the mission, goals, and committee structure of the Association. Directed the research, design, and implementation of administrative procedures and coordinated the writing of an Operations and Policy Manual. Supervised the development of a \$240,000 annual budget. Coordinated the development of a five year organization plan. Redesignated the Storefront Improvement Program and administered it for 15 Columbus central city commercial areas.

Professional consultant and volunteer 1984-1993: Provided professional service and technical assistance to various area organizations, and city and state agencies, on issues related to commercial, residential, and neighborhood revitalization; and arts education and curriculum development. Activities include public relations, marketing, design consultation, advocacy work, and legislation writing. Co-founded and developed the University Community Business Association into a self supporting business. Assisted in the development and writing of the Weiland Park Plan (2006), Campus Partners' A Plan for High Street; Creating a 21st Century Main Street (2000) and University/High Street Development and Design Guidelines (2002). Assisted in the planning, development, funding, and implementation of \$1,000,000 High Street capital improvement project. Participated in the development and writing of the city's first "1986 Planning Overlay" for the University Area Commission and extensive revisions to the legislation in 1991/92. Assisted with the development of "Arts in Schools-Basic Education Grant" (AISBEG), Planning Guide, 1990. Co-authored and produced "Proposals for Change: An Effort of the University Community Towards Developing a Comprehensive Plan," 1990. UCBA Parking and Circulation Study, 1991-93; Oversaw the development of the 1994 Capital Improvements Needs Assessment for the University District and the NCR areas, as well as the 1994, 1995, and 1996 Urban Infrastructure Recovery Fund Improvements for University District Street Restoration, (540 trees) Alley Resurfacing (\$500,000) and Lighting (\$250,000), High Street Capital Improvements, Lane to Arcadia (\$3.3 million) and Seventh to Eleventh (\$1.7 million); Old North Columbus CRA Improvements (\$833,333) and Weiland Park CRA Improvements (\$833,333) Advised State Department of Education on the development of a new Arts Education curriculum model.
