STATEMENT OF HARDSHIP

Chapter 3307 of the Columbus Zoning Code Section 3307.10 Variances by City Council

- A. Permit a variance in the yard, height, or parking requirements of any district only in conjunction with a change in zoning or a use variance and only where there are unusual and practical difficulties or unusual hardships in the carrying out of the zoning district provisions due to an irregular shape of lot, topography, or other conditions, providing such variance will not seriously affect any adjoining property or the general welfare.
- **B.** Permit a use of the property not permitted by the Zoning District established on the property if such use will not adversely affect the surrounding property or surrounding neighborhood and if Council is satisfied that the granting of such variance will alleviate some hardship or difficulty which warrants a variance from the Comprehensive Plan.

Before authorizing any variance from the Zoning Code in a specific case, City Council shall first determine that such variance will not impair an adequate supply of light and air to the adjacent property, unreasonably increase the congestion of Public Streets, increase the danger of fires, endanger the public safety, unreasonably diminish or impair the public health, safety, comfort, morals, or welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Columbus.

In granting a variance pursuant to this section, Council may impose such requirements and conditions regarding the location, character, duration, and other features of the variance proposal as Council deems necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this Zoning Code and to otherwise safeguard the public safety and welfare.

Statement of Hardship:


I would like to inform City Council that by granting me the requested variance, our neighborhood can become a better place for our children's children. Establishing a Type A home child care facility for a maximum of 12 children which will not affect the surrounding properties negatively, nor will it affect the adequate supply of light and air to the surrounding properties. The downfall of the economy has made it harder for working families; our neighborhood is a primary example of it forcing both parents to work to meet stable income. With the support of my neighbors' petition, I want to provide attractive, affordable, and reliable child care services in a home-like setting to a diverse working class community that encourages childhood emotional, social, motor, language and cognitive development. 
