The original contract included services for stormwater improvements for the Marion Road Area Neighborhood Project No. 2. The work includes field surveys/investigations, preparation of construction documents, engineering services during construction, and preparation of as-built drawings.

Modification 1 will include services for the design of a water line replacement in Smith Road between Lockbourne Road and Fairwood Avenue.

Engineering is anticipated to be completed in 2014. Part of the Engineer's contract is to provide record drawings after the construction of this project. Therefore the contract completion date cannot be determined at this time.
