5. **A description of work performed to date as part of the contract and a full description of work to be performed during any future phasing of the contract.**

The work performed under this contract is for electric motors and their associated equipment that require inspection, testing, maintenance, and repair. The work includes documentation of the state of performance of the equipment and can include reports, trending analysis and recommendations for continued optimum performance. These motors are located at the City's two Wastewater Treatment Plants, Sewer Maintenance Operation Center (SMOC), Composting Facility, Water Treatment Plants, or other DPU facilities including various facilities such as pumping stations, grit stations, booster stations, etc. This modification funds the work for year three and exercises our option to renew this contract for the third year. The completion date is extended to March 8, 2015.

6. **An updated contract timeline to contract completion.**

Year 2 March 9, 2013 to March 8, 2014
Year 3 March 9, 2014 to March 8, 2015
Year 4 March 9, 2015 to March 8, 2016

The performance of this project's maintenance activities to provide electric motor inspection, testing, maintenance, repair, reporting and documentation for DPU facility components will help return them to service quickly and maintain peak operational efficiency, which will prevent them from becoming larger, more expensive work that can produce a major impact to the budget. No community outreach or environmental factors are considered for this project.

The contract will continue to provide inspection, testing, maintenance, documentation and repair for the electric motors and their associated equipment at SWWTP, JPWWTP, Compost Facility, SMOC and other DPU facilities.

Anticipated modification. The original contract allows for three (3) extension periods on a year to year basis. This modification is to provide the funding necessary for the payment of services to be provided through March 8, 2015.

The same exact service is required as originally detailed in the RFP. No lower pricing/more attractive terms and conditions are anticipated at this time.

This contract will be funded incrementally with modifications on approximately an annual basis. Five contract modifications are anticipated at this time. If unforeseen issues or difficulties are encountered that would require additional funding, a modification would be requested. The expected cost for this project is as follows:
