Sir,

The following investigation was conducted concerning the City of Columbus' 2025 annual objection to the renewal of liquor permit 04186209-1 issued to JK 2800 LLC, which is doing business as **BP**, located at **2800 Sullivant Avenue**, **Columbus**, **OH 43204**, **Franklin County**.

After reviewing the State of Ohio, Franklin County, and City of Columbus records regarding the above liquor permit establishment, the following information has been compiled to support the objection to the renewal of the aforementioned permit issued by the State of Ohio.

The above listed liquor establishment has been issued a C-1 and C-2 permit by the Division of Liquor. These permits grant the permit holder the privilege to sell alcoholic beverages at the above listed address.

A review of the Columbus Division of Police records revealed the Division of Police has seventeen (17) official police reports concerning incidents at the listed liquor establishment between **January 2024** and **November 2025**. These reports referenced assaults, armed robberies, selling alcohol to a minor, solicitation, shots fired, and drug use, including:

April 20, 2024 – Prostitution October 1, 2024 – Trespassing November 11, 2024 – Assault November 18, 2024 – Shot Spotter December 18, 2024 – Prostitution February 22, 2025 – Liquor Law Offense April 6, 2025 – Robbery July 28, 2025 – Assault November 17, 2025 – Assault

In addition, the Columbus Division of Police and Division of Fire have been dispatched to **2800 Sullivant Avenue**, **Columbus**, **OH 43204** on 206 calls for service, seventy-eight (78) in 2024, and 128 in 2025. These calls for service include a person with a gun, narcotics sales, narcotics use, overdoses, fights, solicitation, assaults, armed robbery, and intoxicated individuals.

A review of the records of Columbus Public Health revealed that there are multiple outstanding violations issued at the last Food Inspection of 2800 Sullivant Avenue. These violations include failure to comply with Food Safety requirements, unsanitary conditions, and food being stored at unsafe temperatures.
