REVISED SCOPE OF SERVICES

ADDENDUM TO 2023 SCOPE OF SERVICES AND PRICING

Equitas Safe Point Safe Syringe Program and Columbus Public Health Department

In Exhibit A, Scope of Services, Contractor agrees to the following:

1. Provide outreach, education and harm reduction services to people who inject drugs (PWID). Harm reduction services shall be offered at 1267 West Broad St., Columbus, Ohio 43222, and/or from the Mobile Unit at physical locations of partner agencies. Outreach, education and harm reduction services shall not be provided from the Mobile Unit at physical locations of partner agencies unless and until the Contractor 1) provides CPH with an executed MOU with the partner agency stating permission of the partner agency for Contractor to host Safe Point services at their location, 2) provides CPH with the specific address and days/hours the Safe Point program will operate at the partner agency location, and 3) provides CPH with a letter of support from the Area Commission in which the partner agency is located. A client receiving services from multiple locations shall not affect the requirements in sections L and M of the Scope of Services as related to identifying unique and returning clients and provisions of the syringe and service allotment schedule.

All other provisions of the original contract shall remain in place for the duration of the contract term.
