Sir,

The following investigation was conducted concerning the City of Columbus' 2020 annual objection to the renewal of liquor permit **95561790005** issued to **Wheatland Food Inc.**, which is doing business as **Wheatland Foods** located at **1432 Mt. Vernon Avenue, Columbus, Ohio 43203**. The recorded owner of said permit is **Amir Alqabae**.

After reviewing the State of Ohio, Franklin County, and City of Columbus records regarding the above liquor permit establishment, the following information has been compiled to support the objection to the renewal of the aforementioned permit issued by the State of Ohio.

The above listed liquor establishment has been issued a **C1, C2, and D6** permits by the Division of Liquor. This permit grants the permit holder the privilege to sell alcoholic beverages at the above listed address.

A review of the Columbus Division of Police records revealed the Division of Police has created **(16)** **sixteen** official police reports concerning incidents at the listed liquor establishment between **January 2019** and **November 2020**. These reports referenced robbery, molesting, assaults, motor vehicle theft, illegal tobacco sales, and accidental overdose, including:

In addition, the Columbus Division of Police have been dispatched to **1432 Mt. Vernon Avenue, Columbus, Ohio 43203** on **(32) thirty-two** calls for service, **(14) fourteen** in 2019, and **(18) eighteen** in 2020 at **Wheatland Foods**. These calls for service include responses to person with a gun, person with a knife, stabbing, assault, narcotics usage and sales, intoxicated persons needing assistance, accidental overdoses, fights and disturbances, and motor vehicle thefts. Additionally, patrol officers have received numerous complaints of narcotics activity occurring immediately in front of the entrance to the Premises.
