Dr. Al-Akhras is president of CAIR-Ohio, and vice chair of the national CAIR board.

Dr. Al-Akhras participates in educational forums, interfaith events, and diversity training to build understanding and cooperation between Muslims and the wider community. Dr. Al-Akhras works in cooperation with numerous agencies.
