Sir,

The following investigation was conducted concerning the City of Columbus' 2020 annual objection to the renewal of liquor permit **46213250005** issued to **Khurram LLC**, which is doing business as **Mobile Mart** located at **830 Parsons Avenue, Columbus, Ohio 43206**. The recorded owners of said permit are **Khurram Shahzad** and **Naqash Ahmed**.

After reviewing the State of Ohio, Franklin County, and City of Columbus records regarding the above liquor permit establishment, the following information has been compiled to support the objection to the renewal of the aforementioned permit issued by the State of Ohio.

The above listed liquor establishment has been issued a **C1 and C2** permits by the Division of Liquor. This permit grants the permit holder the privilege to sell alcoholic beverages at the above listed address.

A review of the Columbus Division of Police records revealed the Division of Police has created **(18) eighteen** official police reports concerning incidents at the listed liquor establishment between **January 2019** and **November 2020**. These reports referenced homicide, robberies, assaults, recovered firearms, drug trafficking, molesting, assaults, and intoxicated individuals needing assistance, including:

In addition, the Columbus Division of Police have been dispatched to **830 Parsons Avenue, Columbus, Ohio 43206** on **(46) forty-six** calls for service, **(32) thirty-two** in 2019, and **(14) fourteen** in 2020 at **Mobile Mart**. These calls for service include responses to a person with a gun, shots fired, robbery, assaults, accidental overdoses, intoxicated persons needing assistance, fights and disturbances, and motor vehicle theft complaints.
