Sir,

The following investigation was conducted concerning the City of Columbus' 2025 annual objection to the renewal of liquor permit 08418994-106 issued to Speedway LLC, which is doing business as **Speedway**, located at **1165 S High St, Columbus, OH 43206, Franklin County**.

After reviewing the State of Ohio, Franklin County, and City of Columbus records regarding the above liquor permit establishment, the following information has been compiled to support the objection to the renewal of the aforementioned permit issued by the State of Ohio.

The above listed liquor establishment has been issued a C-1, C-2, and D-6 permit by the Division of Liquor. These permits grant the permit holder the privilege to sell alcoholic beverages at the above listed address.

A review of the Columbus Division of Police records revealed the Division of Police has thirty-four (34) official police reports concerning incidents at the listed liquor establishment between **January 2024** and **November 2025**. These reports referenced assault, overdoses, menacing, and armed robbery, including:

March 23, 2024 – Theft
August 5, 2024 – Robbery
August 9, 2024 – Robbery
August 10, 2024 – Robbery
August 17, 2024 – Assault
August 18, 2024 – Robbery

November 7, 2024 – Robbery
March 10, 2025 – Overdose
August 2, 2025 – Assault
August 19, 2025 – Assault
August 31, 2025 – Assault

In addition, the Columbus Division of Police and Division of Fire have been dispatched to **1165 S High St, Columbus, OH 43206** on 569 calls for service, 319 in 2024, and 268 so far in 2025. These calls for service include indecent exposure, overdose, menacing, fighting, assaults, drug use, people with knives, people with guns, intoxicated individuals, theft, and robbery.

Furthermore, the Columbus Division of Fire has responded to thirty-two (32) events at the property in 2025. Eight (8) events involved alcohol use, and three (3) events involved the administration of Narcan. Additionally, a review of the Columbus Division of Fire records revealed that there are three (3) outstanding Fire Code violations at 1165 S High Street, including

failure to maintain a CO₂ monitor, junction boxes lacking covers, and obstructed emergency egress paths.
