Formal bid specifications for the Division of Fire's (CFD) thermal image cameras were published on February 26, 2018, and bids were opened on March 22, 2018. The thermal image cameras will be used by CFD during firefighting and hazardous material operations, and the cameras will include truck mounted chargers, all associated hardware and software, as well as on-site training. This Universal Term Contract (UTC) is a two (2) year contract that will expire on May 31, 2020, with an option to extend for one (1) additional year. An estimated one-hundred sixty-two thousand dollars (\$162,000.00) will be spent on this contract over a two (2) year period.

Two (2) bids were received (see attached bid tabulation). One bidder (All-American Equipment) bid the specified product (Mfg.: FLIR / Model #FLIR K65). The second bidder (Kair Inc.) bid an alternate product (Mfg.: Argus/ Model: Mi-TICS). After reviewing product specifications for the alternate product, R&I determined that the bid from Kair Inc. was non-responsive for the following reasons:

 Display Screen: the alternate product (Mi-TICS) bid by Argus offers a three and one-half inch (3-1/2") display screen while the bid specifications called for a four-inch (4") display screen. Field testing conducted by R&I on four (4) different manufacturer's thermal image cameras revealed a marked difference between a 3.5" and a 4" display screen when reading images in a smoke-filled room. The 4" display provided greater clarity and the larger images were more easily read on the display screen.

 Trade-In Allowance: Argus did not provide product pricing and/or a Trade-In Allowance on Proposal Pages 17-18, as requested. The price which the bidder entered within the RFQ document did not provide a Trade-In Allowance either. The Purchasing Office (AOB) spoke with the bidder, and confirmed via email (see attached copy) that their price includes the additional line items (charger, training, etc.) but did not include a Trade-In Allowance, as requested.

 Pricing: the alternate product (Mi-TICS) was higher in cost than the FLIR product when the Trade-In Allowance offered by FLIR was factored into their pricing.

CFD recommends a bid award to All-American Equipment for all three (3) line items as the overall low, responsive,

responsible and best bidder.
