

Subject: **Professional Engineering Services – Joyce Avenue Improvements Phase 2**

The Department of Public Service solicited Requests for Proposals for Professional Engineering Design Services for the Joyce Avenue Improvements Phase 2 project. The Divisions of Transportation and Sewerage and Drainage are cooperating on the joint project for the improvement of the Joyce Avenue and 17th Avenue area. This project will reconstruct Joyce Avenue to a three lane street with curb and gutter, and sidewalks. 17th Avenue will be reconstructed with curb and gutter, and sidewalks from 300 feet west of Billiter Boulevard to the east limits of the intersection at Joyce Avenue. A sidewalk one side of Joyce Avenue will be constructed from the intersection at 17th Avenue to Brentnell Avenue. The work also includes a study and design of a storm sewer system for 17th Avenue between Joyce and Brentnell Avenues.

The estimated design contract budget for the project is \$1,445,000. \$1,100,000 is being provided by the Transportation Division in Joyce Avenue Operation Safewalks funding. The remaining \$345,000 is being provided by the Division of Sewerage & Drainage.

Project Deliverables:

- LG&T Plans with estimates
- F&OC Plans
- Final Construction Estimate
- Roadway and Storm System Improvement Construction Plans
- As-built Plans
- Right-of-way plans if right-of-way is to be acquired.

The project was formally advertised in the City Bulletin and through Columbus Vendor Services. Responses were due May 1, 2008. The city received fourteen (14) responses. All of the proposals were deemed minimally compliant and were fully evaluated when the Evaluation Team met on June 11, 2008.

The RFP Evaluation Team included five members: George Harper, EBOCO; Patti Austin and Randy Bowman of the Transportation Division; Paul Roseberry of the Department of Utilities and Megan Blackford, Public Service Director's representative. I was present as the non-voting facilitator.
