This is a division wide contract to provide janitorial services on an annual basis for various facilities within the City. Currently, the Division of Sewerage and Drainage requires these services for the following five facilities: the Jackson Pike Wastewater Treatment Plant, the Southerly Wastewater Treatment Plant, the Compost Facility, the Sewer Maintenance Operation Center and the Truck Waste Disposal Site. The work includes such services as the daily cleaning of all office areas, restrooms, locker areas, showers, stairs, entrances, lobbies, laboratory areas, hallways and common areas. Specific tasks include but are not limited to trash removal, restroom cleaning, shower stall cleaning, doors, glazing and wall cleaning, sweeping, floor dusting, vacuuming and damp mopping.

4. <u>A narrative timeline for the contract including a beginning date, beginning</u> and ending dates for known phases of the contract and a projected ending date.

This Contract shall remain in force for a period of two years after execution, unless terminated by the City, as described in the Special Provisions of the Contract Documents. The City shall have the option to renew the Contract for an additional two years upon mutual agreement between the parties and approval by the Columbus City Council. This contract was entered into on October 17, 2005.

5. <u>A description of any and all modifications to date including the amounts of</u> <u>each modification and the Contract Number associated with any</u> <u>modification to date. (List each modification separately)</u>

Modification No. 1, Ordinance 0809-2006, passed June 8, 2006 for \$188,270.00.

Modification No. 2, Ordinance 1030-2007, passed July 23, 2007 for \$191,960.00.

This is the third proposed modification.

6. <u>A full description of the work to be performed as part of the proposed</u> <u>contract modification. (Indicating the work to be a logical extension of the</u> <u>contract is not sufficient explanation)</u>

This is an annual maintenance service contract and as such the work will be the same or similar for each fiscal year. Therefore, these maintenance services, once again, include providing work such as the daily cleaning of all office areas, restrooms, locker areas, showers, stairs, entrances, lobbies, laboratory areas, hallways and common areas. Specific tasks include trash removal, restroom cleaning, shower stall cleaning, doors, glazing and wall cleaning, sweeping, floor dusting, vacuuming and damp mopping. for each of the Division's five facilities.

7. If the contract modification was not anticipated and explained in the original contract legislation a full explanation as to the reasons the work could not have been anticipated is required. The contract modification was anticipated and the multiple year term was explained in the original legislation written by Division of Sewerage and Drainage.

8. <u>An explanation of why the work to be performed as part of the contract</u> <u>modification cannot be bid out. (Indicating the work to be a logical</u> <u>extension of the contract is not sufficient explanation)</u>

The initial cost of equipment is too cost prohibitive for a single year contract. It is much more cost effective to amortize over a multiyear contract. Additionally, the training costs for personnel is similarly cost effective when administering a multiyear services contract.
