George Skestos is the founder of Homewood Corporation, a residential building company in Columbus, Ohio. He is now retired.

Mr. Skestos founded Homewood in 1963 and spent 25 years at the helm of the Company. He retired from the firm in 1988. During his tenure as CEO, Homewood constructed more than 10,000 multi-family and approximately 16,000 single family homes. With its primary focus on residential construction, the company also engages in land development and some commercial construction.

He is actively engaged in community and charitable services besides his corporate board memberships. Mr. Skestos has served as a member of the Board of Trustees of The Ohio State University for nine years as well as Trustees' Board representative to The Ohio State University Hospital. Formerly, he was a member of the Board of Directors of Central Benefits and Midland Insurance Company. In addition, he was also a director on the Huntington Bancshares He heads the two foundations he established: IHS Foundation, devoted to helping the homeless and Salem Lutheran Foundation, which provides scholarships for you men studying for the ministry within Wisconsin Synod. His present Directorships include: Ohio State University Hospital Board, University Hospital East, Columbus Association for Performing Arts and Columbus Airport Authority.

A native of Owosso, Michigan, Mr. Skestos earned a Bachelor of Arts and Sciences Degree, a Master of Business Administration Degree and a Juris Doctorate from the University of Michigan. He served as Lieutenant in the United States Navy from 1954-1956.
