Karen Morrison serves as a corporate officer in her roles as president of the OhioHealth Foundation and senior vice president of OhioHealth Corporation. She has been with OhioHealth for over twenty years serving as a health care executive, attorney and lobbyist currently leading the enterprise strategy for external relations including community relations, corporate reinvestment and government and regulatory affairs. She manages the local, state and federal advocacy strategy for the enterprise and is an experienced leader in health care public policy. In her role as the Foundation president, Ms. Morrison provides executive fundraising leadership to advance the philanthropic mission of the enterprise and she oversees all aspects of the Foundation's strategic operations.

OhioHealth is the parent company for twelve owned hospitals, two managed hospitals, 20 health and surgery centers, a comprehensive home care provider, hospice and rehabilitation services. The enterprise serves a forty county region and represents 21,000 employees and 2500 physicians. The corporation generates in excess of \$2.5 billion in revenue and is consistently ranked as one of the top ten health systems in the country. For eight consecutive years, OhioHealth is one of FORTUNE's 100 Best Places to Work in America.

Ms. Morrison completed her undergraduate degree at Vanderbilt University; her graduate professional degree in Preventive Medicine at The Ohio State University College of Medicine and Public Health; and her law degree from Capital University, where she recently served two terms on its Board of Trustees.

She also serves as a member of the Board of Trustees for Fifth Third Bank, Vanderbilt University Alumni Association, Ohio Chamber of Commerce, Experience Columbus, McConnell Arts Center of Worthington and the Center for Healthy Families. In March 2012, she was appointed by Columbus Mayor Michael B. Coleman to serve on the Board of Health for a second term, and serves as chair. She was recently appointed by Governor John Kasich to the Bowling Green State University Board of Trustees.

Ms. Morrison is a member of the American College of Healthcare Executives, the Public Affairs Council, the American Public Health Association and the Advisory Board's Philanthropy Council. Additionally, she is a member of the Executive Leadership Council and The Links, Incorporated, serving on its national executive council for the past six years.
