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Columbus Public Health's 340B pharmaceuticals are currently being procured from vendors awarded from a public bid. Crosby's Drugs stores all of these tuberculosis medications and distributes to our patients based on physician/APRN orders as well as fulfills compound pharmaceuticals. There is a national supply chain shortage of TB medications rendering them unavailable from our contracted suppliers. This has greatly increased the cost of TB medications. Crosby's is able to source these medications from other suppliers on an emergency basis when unavable which has resulted in the contract exceeding \$50,000.00.

4. If lowest bid was not accepted, Explain:

Impractical to bid - Crosby Drugs is the only HRSA 340B approved Contract Pharmacy in Central Ohio that supplies tuberculosis medications. Pharmacy services are currently ongoing with Crosby's Drugs and a disruption to those services could be harmful to patients being treated at the Ben Franklin TB Clinic. Pharmacist and pharmacist technician services for the Ben Franklin TB Clinic, includes receipt, off-site storage, re-packaging, labeling, tracking, and dispensing of CPH-owned 340B drugs to TB patients. Crosby's is familiar with TB clinic prescribing processes, including medication handling, compounding, invoicing, Medicaid billing reconciliation and distribution of 340B medications utilized by the clinic.
