This contract provides professional design services and services during construction for the Fairwood Facility Improvements project. This contract will assess the current Fairwood Facility conditions, needed improvements, and evaluate the existing emergency power system and document it in a report. The project currently has four construction contracts planned to be performed.

F31 - HVAC Improvements

Provides the removal and replacement of a rooftop Air Handler Unit on the existing building and one boiler on the building's mezzanine.

F34 – Building Improvements

Provides replacement of the existing second story brick fascia with metal siding and related tasks.

<u>F35 – Fairwood Facility and 910 Dublin Road Fuel Station Improvements</u> Provides the replacement and upgrade of the existing vehicle fueling facilities at the Fairwood Facility and at the Utilities Complex at 910 Dublin Road.

<u>F36 – Fairwood Facility Renovations for DPU Reorganization</u>

Provides improvements to building utilization and the necessary renovations to the Fairwood Facility to accommodate the planned DPU reorganization and relocation of Department of Public Utilities (DPU) staff to Fairwood.

The building emergency power system evaluation report's recommendations were reviewed by the City. It was determined that no revisions or upgrades of this system are required at this time.

The actual emplacement of the designed work will be by construction contract. This contract modification will provide preliminary and detailed design services for Contract F36.

Design services have been completed for Contracts F31, F34 and F35.

6. <u>An updated contract timeline to contract completion.</u>

The Design Professional (DP) began Preliminary Design after the Notice to Proceed was issued on December 15, 2008.

F31 - HVAC Improvements

The DP was directed to prepare contract documents for the HVAC Improvements, F31 on April 2, 2009. The design was completed and the construction contract bids were received on May 6, 2009. The Notice to Proceed was issued on November 9, 2009. Construction is completed and contract has been closed out.

<u>F34 – Building Improvements</u>

The DP provided the results of the Fairwood building evaluation and required improvements on April 17, 2009. The design for Building Improvements, F34 was completed and the construction contract bidding was placed on hold due to funding constraints. The design was completed and the construction contract bids were received on June 16, 2010. The Notice to Proceed was issued on December 10, 2010. Construction is nearly completed. The contract will be closed out after construction completion.

F35 – Fairwood Facility and 910 Dublin Road Fuel Station Improvements

The DP has prepared the contract documents for Contract F35 for the replacement and upgrade of the existing vehicle fueling facilities at the Fairwood Facility and at the Utilities Complex at 910 Dublin Road. The construction contract bids were received on February 17, 2010. The Notice to Proceed was issued on June 28, 2010. Construction is completed and contract closed out is in progress.

F36 – Fairwood Facility Renovations for DPU Reorganization

Additional building improvements were identified in 2011, following the building evaluation report. After approval of this modification, the DP will conduct an existing conditions assessment, prepare a preliminary design report and prepare contract documents for improvements to the Fairwood Facility to accommodate the planned Department of Public Utilities (DPU) reorganization and relocation of DPU staff to Fairwood. The construction contract's bid opening is planned for September 2012. The construction work will be placed under contract as soon as possible, and the construction engineering services will commence. The DP's Services During Construction, that include Technical Project Representation (TPR) to interpret contract requirements and to verify the construction Contractor's compliance with the project's technical requirements, start-up and commissioning assistance, record documentation preparation assistance. Construction Management, Administrative Services, Field Project Representation (FPR) and Materials Testing and Evaluation Services will be performed by others.

Braun & Steidl's services will continue beyond completion of construction to provide "asbuilt" record drawings of the constructed facilities. 7. <u>A narrative discussing the economic impact or economic advantages of the project;</u> <u>community outreach or input in the development of the project; and any environmental</u> <u>factors or advantages of the project.</u>

There are currently four DPU buildings housing Department administrative offices. With the planned DPU reorganization and relocation to the Fairwood Facility, there will be only two. This provides economic advantages by reducing overall facilities operating costs. The two buildings to be vacated currently require major repairs and renovations. By not performing these repairs and renovations, there will be a savings in the capital improvement budget. No community outreach or environmental factors are considered for this project.

PROPOSED MODIFICATION NO. 4: \$386,000.00

This modification provides \$386,000.00 of funding for an existing conditions assessment, preparation of a preliminary design report and for detailed design services for Contract F36. Funding is provided by DOSD.

Additional building improvements were identified in 2011, following the building evaluation report in 2009. The work in this Modification No. 4 was not originally anticipated, but is a continuation of the services originally included within the existing contract's scope of service. The work to be performed is to accommodate the planned DPU reorganization and relocation of DPU staff to the Fairwood Facility.
