Subject: Pedestrian Safety Improvements – Weinland Park Community Mobility Plan

The Department of Public Service solicited Requests for Proposals for the Pedestrian Safety Improvements – Weinland Park Community Mobility Plan. The budget is \$135,000; amount of the contract shall be \$135,000 funded by a 2011 bonds.

The intent of this project is to provide the Department of Public Service, Division of Mobility Options, additional resources for engineering services to preliminary engineer and design recommendations from the Weinland Park Community Mobility Plan (WPCMP). Work will include detailed design of several features throughout the Weinland Park area, in addition to the 4th Street and Summit Street corridors. Designs are to conform to the Weinland Park Community Mobility Plan unless specified otherwise.

The project was formally advertised on the Vendor Services web site from June 20, 2011, to July 21, 2011. The city received six (6) responses. A proposal from RW Armstrong and Associates was deemed non-responsive due to their not meeting all required ODOT pre-qualification categories. The remaining five (5) proposals were fully evaluated when the Evaluation Committee met on August 9, 2011. The responding firms were:

Proposal Findings:

Section A of Moody Nolan's proposal lists Moody Nolans's percentage of work as 50% and Lawhon & Associates as 5%, while Section B lists 45% for Moody Nolan and 10% for Lawhon & Associates.

This RFP Evaluation Committee included three (3) voting members from the Department of Public Service – Jennifer Gallagher, Hassan Zahran and Randall Bowman – a representative from EBOCO was invited to attend, but declined, and Jennifer Atkinson.

Moody-Nolan received 85.33 points from the Evaluation Committee (out of a possible 100). The next closest firm was Stantec Consulting Services, Inc. with 83.33 points.
