Site Information

- The 1.12± acre site is an infill-type annexation.
- The current use for the site is a single family home, which is not anticipated to change.
- The site is located within the boundaries of the Northwest Plan, which recommends Low Density Residential for the site.
- The site is not within the boundaries of an Area Commission.
- The site requires a boundary conformance pursuant to an annexation agreement between Columbus and Perry Township.

Key Issues

- Annexation is sought to obtain city services.
- Planning staff have conducted a preliminary review and are supportive of the proposed use. The site is designated as “Single Family Option” in the annexation agreement with Perry, and consistent with the agreement its use will not change.
- Annexation does not guarantee a zoning application will be approved. Zoning requests require a separate application process through the Department of Building and Zoning Services.

Legislative Information

- The Ohio Revised Code stipulates that once an annexation has been approved by the county, it must be accepted by the receiving municipality in order for the annexation process to be complete. City acceptance must take place a minimum of 60 days after the Clerk receives notice of County approval. Should action not be taken by the City within 120 days of the first consideration of an acceptance ordinance, the annexation does not take place.
