The work under the Modification No. 2 will require the firm to continue providing professional construction management services for the OARS Phase I and II projects.

The Construction phase of the OARS project will extend to June 2015. It is expected that construction management services will be required into 2015 to ensure proper project completion. This is a Modification to the original contract, for the period covering April 2012 through March 2013.

This contract will have multiple modifications in order to best meet project needs. 2010 cost was \$2,663,185. This Contract Modification No. 2, covering April 2012-March 2013 period, is for \$8,322,762.
