The work includes furnishing Construction Administration / Inspection services for the 2014 – 2016 fiscal years for Division of Sewerage and Drainage and Division of Water projects. The work includes full-time or part-time Construction Administration Services including resident project inspection for any specific project identified. In general the consultant will respond to the contractor's requests for information, respond to inquiries regarding the interpretation of the contract documents, review contractors claims for additional services and costs, review quality or materials/equipment substitutions and provide recommendations

*Future modifications are anticipated but unknown at this time. Future contract modifications will have the same scope of services; however the contract cost will vary based on the size, location and complexity of the projects listed in the modification.

The Rehabilitation and Replacement (R&R) program has continued to grow in size and number of projects. The individual projects within the program have also shown an increase in the total length of water main replacement compared to previous year's projects. Due to this, the amount of inspection required has increased to accommodate the increased size of the projects.
