This legislation authorizes the Director of Public Utilities to continue a professional services agreement with Smoot Construction Company of Ohio for Professional Construction Management Services for Small Projects (PCMS). The contract provides construction administration and management services including: construction inspection, construction and startup coordination, reporting, budgeting, scheduling, document tracking, and related tasks associated with construction contracts.

• Indianola Exterior Improvements Indianola Exterior Site Imp's, CIP P690026-100005: This project provides for exterior site improvements to the 3500 and 3568 Indianola Ave facilities, including pavement, drainage, lighting, security, parking, etc.

- <u>Hap Cremean Water Treatment Plant Lagoon #1 Sludge Removal, CIP P690331-</u> <u>100003</u>: This project will provide for the physical removal of sludge from Lagoon 1 at the Hap Cremean Water Plant.
- Fisher Road Booster Station Roof Replacement, CIP P690473-100009: This project consists of the replacement of the existing flat membrane roof and minor structural repairs, HVAC, electrical and plumbing improvements.
