The Division of Water agreed to pay the City of Reynoldsburg a portion of the cost for installation of an altitude valve at the Taylor Road water storage tank site. The terms stated by the City of Columbus was 50% of the construction and labor cost, up to a maximum amount of \$30,000.00.

(Additional work was completed at the site to comply with Ohio EPA requirements, but this work is not included in the reimbursement by the City of Columbus.)
