The City of Columbus Jackson Pike Wastewater Treatment Plan Primary Clarifier Electrical Upgrades work consists of replacing existing electrical equipment for the A-Plant and B-Plant primary clarifiers including but not limited to electrical conduits, wiring, local control panels, disconnect switches, related supports and supporting systems, installation of new overhead electrical conduit support systems, replacement and rehabilitation of motor control centers, replacement of motors and gearboxes for sludge collection equipment and tilt tubes, demolition of existing electrical conduits, wiring, local control panels, disconnect switches, repairs to concrete and handrails and other such work as may be necessary to complete the contract, in accordance with the drawings, technical specifications, and City of Columbus Construction and Material Specifications.

Contract work is required to be completed in a manner acceptable to the City within 782 days from the date that a Notice To Proceed (NTP) is given by the City.
