Mound District Booster Station 20-Inch Discharge Line: The purpose of the project is to provide transmission main improvements to accommodate the increased pumping capacity associated with the new Mound district water booster station. These improvements were recommended in the Division of Water's Distribution System Master Plan to meet projected future water demands in the area. The Neighborhood Liaison(s) was contacted and informed of this project. Further community outreach may result through the Neighborhood Liaison Program.

HCWP Wash Water Tank Interior & Exterior Coating: This wash water storage tank provides water for the filter backwash operation at HCWP. The storage tank was installed in 1989 and the protective coatings on the interior and exterior of the steel tank are past their expected lifetime and require removal and replacement to avoid more costly structural repairs that would be needed if the coating systems are not maintained. These improvements extend the life of the tank and contribute to reliable water treatment plant operations for the supply of safe drinking water.
