

Dr. Kevin L. Dixon, Ph.D.

Dr. Kevin L. Dixon is vice president of community and cultural engagement at the Alcohol, Drug, and Mental Health Board of Franklin County (ADAMH). He is responsible for developing community-based initiatives that address a wide-range of behavioral health issues that include school district initiatives, faith-based, immigrant and refugee populations, prevention programs, and other key collaborations. In the early 90s, Dixon directed the ADAMH Board's innovative cultural training project, culminating in a successful series of national conferences.

Dixon is originally from Philadelphia (PA), where he was assistant director for Temple University's Community Education Program. While in Philadelphia, he co-hosted and produced weekend talk shows on WDAS radio for eight years. Among his many interviews, include filmmaker Gordon Parks, former Black Panther Bobby Seale, activist Dick Gregory, musicians Grover Washington, Jr., James Brown and others. In 1986 Dixon was named team historian and reporter for paraplegic swimmer Jim McGowan's historic English Channel swim in Dover, England. This event was covered by news agencies worldwide, including China and the Russian TASS News Agency.

Dixon was former station manager for WIXQ-FM college radio at Millersville University. He serves on numerous boards and committees, including past chair of PrimaryOne Health, and serves on WBNS-10 TV Jefferson Awards Blue Ribbon Panel for outstanding volunteer service in central Ohio, and the Ohio Psychological Association Foundation Board.
