The Division of Water (DOW) purchased property at the south east corner of Home Road and SR 745, abutting the west bank of the Scioto River, for construction of future facilities. The Division has no operational use for the majority of the existing structures on the site and contracted with Resource International, Inc. to perform the design, preparation of bidding documents, and assistance during bidding for the demolition project. Demolishing the existing facilities will reduce operation and maintenance costs and prepare the site for eventual development by the City. Demolition includes removal of above and below grade structures, buried and above ground utilities, and other features.

Renewal No. 1 (current) will establish Engineering Services During Construction. See No. 9 for a more detailed description of work.

As part of the demolition project a decommissioned wastewater treatment plant directly adjacent to the Scioto River will be properly demolished. The Scioto River is a major component of the water supply for the City of Columbus. Protection of the riparian corridor for this water supply will help ensure the quality of the water supply for the City of Columbus.
