The RREACT project team reached out to Franklin County Children Services to learn what organization could help first responders effectively support the needs of children and family members impacted by overdose. Children Services referred the project team to Franklin County Family and Children First Council. Franklin County Family and Children First Council specializes in trauma management and resource coordination for children and families engaged in multiple systems. Franklin County Family and Children First Council is the organization to which Children Services refers complex cases involving trauma and multi-system service coordination. Franklin County Family and Children First Council also provides Trauma Informed Care training to Franklin County Children Services staff, Franklin County Juvenile Court Staff, local public school teachers and school administration, and other providers working directly with high-risk populations.

3. Describe efforts to determine/verify that the company is the sole source:

Independent review of service providers in Columbus, Ohio substantiated Franklin County Family and Children First Council's niche in the social service market related to multi-system care coordination, trauma services, trauma training

4. Indicate how the price or fee structure was determined:

Over the two years of the grant, . Franklin County Family and Children First Council will dedicate approximately 3015 hours of work to REACT @ a rate of \$125 per hour for a maximum of \$378,000 November 1, 2018 through September 30, 2020
