WHEREAS, it is necessary to amend Sections of Chapter 919 of the Columbus City Code to grant the Director of Recreation and Parks the authority to set policy and guidelines for issuing permits without requiring a fixed number in City Code; now, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

SECTION 1. That the following Sections of Chapter 919 of the Columbus City Code be amended to read as follows:

919.06 - Permits.

- (A) No person, in any park, shall participate in any meeting, parade or other organized activity involving more than ten (10) persons without a permit issued by the director.
- (A) <u>Parks and facilities designated for rentals may not be used for organized activity without a permit issued by the director and may not be used for any activity if a permit has been issued to another group or individual. Permits may also be required when an event, meeting or organized activity impacts a park beyond normal use, or additional City services are needed.</u>
- (B) No person shall fail to comply with the fee requirements or other terms and conditions of any such permit issued under the provisions of this chapter.
- (C) All permits issued by the director must be exhibited in a clear and conspicuous location and produced upon the demand of any law enforcement officer.

SECTION 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
