Congratulations on your recent award! The Office for Civil Rights (OCR), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) has been delegated the responsibility for ensuring that recipients of federal financial assistance from the OJP, the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS), and the Office on Violence Against Women (OVW) are not engaged in discrimination prohibited by law. Several federal civil rights laws, such as Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, require recipients of federal financial assistance to give assurances that they will comply with those laws. Federal funding from this award will be used for the following goals/objectives: 1) Purchase additional instrumentation, equipment, and software to increase our capacity by enabling us to process DNA samples faster/more efficiently; 2) Hire a laboratory technician to assist with processing, recording, and screening forensic DNA samples; 3) Reduce/prevent a DNA case backlog by purchasing supplies necessary to process DNA samples; and 4) Provide the required annual continuing education for analysts, which will enable us to stay up to date with current requirements, methods, and policies within the DNA community.
