This legislation authorizes the Director of Public Utilities to enter into an energy curtailment services agreement with NRG Curtailment Solutions, Inc. for the DPU Water and Wastewater Facilities and DOP retail consumers. The contract provides energy curtailment services that will generate a revenue stream for the department and for DOP retail customers who choose to participate. The Department has determined that these services cannot be performed by City personnel.

6. <u>A narrative timeline for the contract including a beginning date, beginning and ending dates for known phases of the contract and a projected ending date.</u>

This will be a three year contract commencing in 2020. There is an option to renew for two additional 12 month terms at the sole discretion of DPU.

7. <u>A narrative discussing the economic impact or economic advantages of the project;</u> <u>community outreach or input in the development of the project; and any environmental</u> <u>factors or advantages of the project.</u>

The performance of this energy curtailment services agreement will generate revenue for the DPU and for DOP retail customers who choose to participate. No community outreach or environmental factors are considered for this project.

8. <u>An estimate of the full cost of the Contract including a separate estimate of any and all phases or proposed future contract modifications.</u>

This contract will be a three year agreement. Adjustments to payment rates and scope to this contract beyond those outlined in the agreement are not anticipated. Based on the energy

curtailment performance of the water and wastewater facilities in 2019, estimated revenue for the Department from 2020 activities could be approximately \$450,000 for the year. No funding is required for these services.
