Work under this project consists of replacement of the Sludge Control Building rooftop unit, and other such work as may be necessary to complete the contract, in accordance with the drawings, technical specifications, and City of Columbus Construction and Material Specifications as set forth in this Invitation For Bid (IFB).

Contract work is required to be completed in a manner acceptable to the City within 210 days (substantial completion) and 240 calendar days (final completion) from the date that a Notice To Proceed (NTP) is given by the City. The City anticipates issuing a Notice to proceed on or about June 2020.

Many of the HVAC & air purification units are approaching the end of their useful life and are becoming increasingly difficult to repair and maintain. A DOSD replacement program was developed under CIP 650265-100100. Replacement of failing HVAC & air purification units will provide proper environmental controls for essential process equipment, electrical

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equipment, furnishings, structures and documents. The replacement units will help to extend the useful life of the building and all equipment inside and inhibit deterioration.

The bid amount and proposed award amount is \$286,248.00, including a 20% construction contingency amount that will be utilized to fund needed and approved changes in the work.
