5. A description of work performed to date as part of the contract and a full description of work to be performed during any future phasing of the contract. The planning area should also be listed as well as any street or neighborhood names.

Black and Veatch provided investigation, inspection and safety evaluation of the O'Shaughnessy Dam Hydroelectric facility as mandated by the FERC (Federal Energy Regulatory Committee). FERC mandates an independent consultant review of the facility and water supply dam every five years. The review included investigation, condition inspection and safety evaluation of the hydroelectric facility and the dam, and also included engineering evaluations related to dam safety. This inspection was performed by a qualified Independent Consultant as defined in CFR Title 18, Part 12, Subpart D. A Potential Failure Modes Analysis (PFMA) workshop and report was also completed as part of the Independent Consultant Review.

Under Renewal #1 (current), the consultant will perform an evaluation of design requirements for minor improvements that were identified during the independent consultant review of the facility, including hydraulic and hydrologic evaluations.

A future renewal is anticipated for design and engineering services during construction.

### 6. An updated contract timeline to contract completion.

- a. **The original agreement allowed for a total term of how many years?** The original agreement was required to complete the Independent Consultant Inspection as Part 12D report for submittal to FERC by the February 1, 2020 deadline.
- b. Which year of the total term is this renewal for? This is for evaluation of design requirements for minor improvements as identified during the independent consultant review of the facility which included the Potential Failure Modes Analysis. It is anticipated this phase will last 16 months.
- c. The next renewal is for Detailed Design and Services During Construction, construction is anticipated to begin in Jan. 2022 and last 9 months.

The O'Shaughnessy Dam is a significant component in the City of Columbus water supply for the Dublin Road Water Plant. This inspection is a mandated regulatory requirement for continued operation of this facility. The dam is considered "secure infrastructure" by the Department of Homeland Security and no public input is solicited for this work.

This is the first contract renewal for this project.

This work is based on the Independent Consultant Inspection Report prepared in the initial phase of this project. Bidding this work to potentially have a new consultant perform the work would delay the project, potentially require rework/duplication of effort, and would increase costs to the City
