Jen is currently a public member of the Ohio Home Inspector Board, which was created under Senate Bill 255, adding a crucial layer of regulation previously missing from the home buying process.

Helping to establish New Resource Solutions, a platform developed to efficiently connect clean energy projects with clean energy investors, Jen now sits on the Board of Directors.
