Ms. Hill joined Homeport d.b.a. Columbus Housing Partnership (CHP) in 1990 and currently serves as Senior Vice President of Community and Government Relations since 2016. Her responsibilities encompass overseeing Resource Development Philanthropy, Marketing, and Public Relations; commits to fundraise over \$2 million in contributions and grants, and facilitates Community and Government Relations for Homeport. She was the Vice President of Community and Government Relations from 1997 - 2016. In that capacity, she provided management oversight of all Homeport Community and Government relations, and networked with other organizations to promote awareness of Affordable Housing and other related Human Services concerns.
